126⁽²²⁾ Apologies and reasons for absence

127⁽²²⁾ Declarations of interests from members regarding matters on the agenda

128⁽²²⁾ Public Forum Session

Residents from Draycot Cerne raised concerns about of the state of the road leading to the hamlet and said that ad-hoc filling of the potholes was no longer a viable option. The Clerk agreed to liaise with Wiltshire Highways to see what else can be done and if it might be possible to put it on their road re-surfacing programme.

- a) Cllr D Spencer gave a brief update on Parish Steward matters. He has received a few requests for the hedges to be cut back along Sutton Lane, leading to the Meadow.
- b) **Speed Indicator Device** Cllr L Craig reported that the training had been completed by the volunteers and she was waiting on a date from Ringway for the post installations.
- c) Other Highways It was <u>resolved not to approve</u> a request for additional street lighting along the western end of the High Street as the Council had committed to other priorities for traffic calming, etc., along Seagry Road, the High Street and Sutton Lane and was not in favour of adding further to light pollution/energy consumption.
