#### 143<sup>(22)</sup> Apologies and reasons for absence

#### 145<sup>(22)</sup> Public Forum Session

Residents from Queens Close raised concerns following the submission of a planning application to replace the garages with a residential dwelling, including access issues (which we again advised were a civil matter), covenants on the sale (also advised this was a civil matter), the lack of an ecology report especially as there are slow-worms on the site and the grassed area is the soak away for 4 adjacent properties.

# 154<sup>(22)</sup> Flooding/Emergency Plan

Cllr J Williams reported on his, and the Clerk's, meeting with the Flood Resilience Office at Wilts Council about what measures could be taken when the River Avon floods and causes the B4069 to become impassable. The FRO agreed to contact the Environment Agency to discuss the opening/closing of the radial gates on the Avon to see if this would help. She also invited us to the next Northern Flood Working Group in March.

# 155<sup>(22)</sup> Environment & Sustainability

Cllr J Williams advised that he has reported the fly-tipping along Seagry Road, near the M4 bridge.

#### 156<sup>(22)</sup> Village Hall

Cllr J Campbell reported that the Quiz Night went well and raised funds for the VH. The VHMC are a bit disappointed that the extension proposals have had to be put on hold until the S106 funding is available.
